Saved for a Reason

In May 2006, my 31 year old daughter, Claire, phoned me at about 9pm from NYC and asked me for the symptoms of a heart attack. I advised her what I knew from my heart attack two years earlier. Claire said she didn't feel right. I advised her to take aspirin and, if the symptoms got worse, to get to the local hospital, immediately. Her husband, Horacio, phoned us at about midnight and advised that Claire had a heart attack and was in the General Hospital. Claire went downstairs and asked her husband to call 911. Thank God the NYC Fire Department emergency response team was in the neighborhood

and took quick action. The Technicians used defibrillators to shock Claire's heart back to life twice. They said, if Claire had not gone downstairs to the courtyard, they would have lost her. When we received her husband's call, Eileen and I immediately took out our Rosary beads and said the Joyful Mysteries together. We went to Nativity morning Mass to pray for Claire's survival and recovery. Gay Brigance used her PC in the Parish Office to make a priority prayer petition to the 1,100 Divine Mercy Prayer Chaplets throughout the world. Claire was also prayed for at Mass at Nativity and in the Parish prayer journal. When I arrived at the hospital in NYC over the weekend, the nurses directed

me to the "Miracle Girl", who was walking down the hall asking everyone who would listen, how long it would be before she could be discharged, so she could be home with her daughters, Nicole and Faith. Claire was discharged on the Tuesday after Memorial Day, five days after her heart attack and NYFD life saving experience. The following summer, while Claire was home for a medical appointment, she looked out her window and saw a pregnant woman fall on the courtyard pavement in front of her home. Claire went downstairs, went over to the woman, who she didn't know, and asked her how she was. She said I feel OK, but I'm concerned about the baby I'm carrying. Claire

asked the woman if she could massage the woman's stomach to relax her. While she was massaging the woman's stomach, Claire felt the baby in the womb and massaged the baby's heart and stomach gently. When the woman visited her Gynecologist the following week, the woman mentioned that she had a recent fall. The Gynecologist examined the woman and the baby in her womb and asked: "Who restarted your baby's heart?" Every Thanksgiving since, Claire receives a thank you card and a small gift from the woman for saving her baby's life. Claire says her best gift is seeing the little baby developing into a happy, healthy child. We have heard that God works in mysterious ways. After learning of this heart-warming experience, we feel Claire was saved for a reason.
